1. KDF-APMA Consultative Meeting.

APMA board representatives sought and held a consultative meeting with the Kenya Defense Forces on 11th January 2023 where business collaboration between APMA and KDF was discussed. Although KDF raised some issues (mainly quality and safety), they expressed their readiness to work together with local parts manufacturers especially in direct procurement of automotive parts.

2. APMA participation in drafting the National Automotive Bill.

APMA has been participating through the chair in drafting of the National Automotive Bill. The bill is still in drafting stage. No further details are available to be shared at this point.

3. Participation in the AfCFTA Business Forum in South Africa.

APMA participated through the chair in the AfCFTA business forum in Cape Town, South Africa (Apr 2023). The trading bloc seeks to create a market of 1.3 billion people, and the private sector needs to prepare itself to make the AfCFTA work for them. This means expanding businesses, strengthening competitiveness, boosting innovation, and creating jobs.

4. AAAM-VDA Study Tour to Kenya.

In June 2023, a delegation from South Africa made a study tour to Kenya and visited several parts manufacturers. The delegation comprised of African Association of Automotive Manufacturers (AAAM), and was represented by the CEO, Dave Coffey, and The German Association of Automotive Industries (VDA) between 5th and 9th June 2023.
